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1. DISTRICT AT A GLANCE

1:1 GENERAL

Kokrajhar is one of the 35 (thirty-five) districts of the state of Assam and can be said to be the gateway to the north-eastern region of India. Both road and rail networks touch this district at Srirampur before they go on to other districts in Assam and the other north-eastern states. The district has a total area of 3,169.22 sq. Km and a total population of 8, 86,999 as per Census, 2011 on transfer of some areas under newly created Chirang district in 2003. Kokrajhar district is located on the north bank of the river Brahmaputra that slices the state of Assam into two, identified as north and south banks. The district lies roughly between 89.46' to 90.38' east longitudes and between 26.19' to 26.54' north latitudes. The district is bounded on the north by the Himalayan Kingdom of Bhutan, by Dhubri district on the south, Chirang district on the east and the interstate boundary of West Bengal on the west.

1:2 HISTORIES

Kokrajhar was originally a part of the undivided Goalpara district. Till 1956, it was merely a small village with a railway station that connected it to the rest of the world. In 1957, a new Civil Sub-division was created after carving out the northern part of Dhubri Sub-division and some parts of Goalpara Sub-division. The area covered by the then Kokrajhar Sub-division consisted of five tracts of the Eastern Dooars, viz., Bijni, Sidli, Chirang, Ripu and Guma with a total area of 4,065.88 sq. km. On the 1st of July, 1983 the Kokrajhar Sub-division was upgraded into Kokrajhar district with the headquarters at Kokrajhar town. There were four police stations in the old district and presently it has eight Police Stations. The area of the district then extended from the river Manas in the east to the Sonkosh to the west.

In 1989, there was further reorganization of the districts and some new districts were created. Thus, about 40% of the total geographical area of Kokrajhar district was carved out for inclusion in the new district of Bongaigaon. The area delineated from Kokrajhar district to Bongaigaon covers the entire Bijni Revenue Circle along with about 347.50 sq. km of Sidli Circle. Later on 20 villages of Nayekgaon G.P. with a total area of 40.22 sq. km under Chapar Revenue Circle of Dhubri district was transferred to Kokrajhar district. Consequently, upon creation of Bodoland Territorial Council under Sixth Schedule to the Constitution of India in the year 2003, the Kokrajhar district was reorganized by inclusion of villages from Dhubri district. Again the Chirang district was created after formation of Bodoland Territorial Council. The present geographical area of Kokrajhar district is estimated to be 3,169.22 sq. km. The district now has three revenue subdivisions- Kokrajhar, Gossaigaon and Parbatjhora.

1:3 LOCATIONS

The Kokrajhar District roughly lies between 89°46' to 90°38' east Longitude and between 26°19' to 26°54' N latitude. The northern side of the district is bounded by the IndoBhutan International boundary and the southern side by Bongaigaon and Dhubri District. The Chirang and the Bongaigaon District falls in the east and the Dhubri District and West Bengal in the west.

1:5 NATURAL CALAMITIES

Flood occurs generally in the low-lying areas of the district during May to August every year. Late flood during the later part of September & October also occurs. The occurrence of flood in the district is due to the a few rivers and its tributaries. During rainy days Kokrajhar town also witnesses localised flood due to poor drainage system. Besides, the district is located in the most seismically active region of the country i.e. zone V.

1:6 POPULATIONS

The district has a total of 8, 86,999 population as per 2011 census. Thus, nearly 97.59% of the total populations of the district live in villages. Out of the total population, 4, 52,965 are Males and 4, 34,034 are Females. Literacy rate of Kokrajhar is 66.63% of which 73.44% are males and 59.54% are females.

1:7 GEOLOGY AND GEOMORPHOLOGY

The Soil condition of District is a heterogeneous one. The Soil of the northern part of the district is clayey and loamy whereas middle part is loamy and sandy. The Soil of the southern part of the district is composed of sandy soil.

1:8 PHYSICAL FEATURES:

The entire area of the District is situated at the foothills of Himalayas. The rivers and tributaries of the district originated from the foothills of the Himalayan Range and are wild in nature and have enormous contribution towards the agrarian economy of the district.

1:9 CLIMATE AND RAINFALL:

Agro-climatically, the district falls under the lower Brahmaputra Valley zone and experiences a humid sub-tropical climate with high rainfall and humidity. The district receives rainfall due to the influence of South West tropical monsoon during the period from April to October with occasional winter showers. The average rainfall in the district varies between 2400-3000 mm annually.

2. FLOOD SITUATION IN KOKRAJHAR DISTRICT

2:1 NATURE & CAUSES OF FLOODS IN KOKRAJHAR

Though the Kokrajhar district does not have any major rivers, yet the district has been experiencing severe floods for the last two and three years. The nature of the Floods in the Kokrajhar is different from the other parts of Assam as it is not directly affected by the river Brahmaputra. Flood occurs generally in the low-lying areas of the district during May to August every year. Late flood during the latter part of September & October also occurs. The occurrence of flood in the district is due to the a few rivers and its tributaries. During rainy days, Kokrajhar town also witnesses localized flood due to poor drainage system. Major causes of the floods in the districts are as follows:

- The general reason of occurrence of flood in Kokrajhar District is due to overflow of river Saralbhanga, Sonkosh, Gaurang, Hell, Gangiya, Champamati and their tributaries.
- The **excessive rains** in the upper catchment areas of Kokrajhar District as well as Bhutan Hills results in overflow of all the rivers, especially, Saralbhanga and submerges the low-lying areas of Kokrajhar District
- Increase in **siltation** resulting rise in riverbeds due to **erosion** in the Catchment areas.
- Encroachment in the grazing land & natural drainage systems creates the Water Logging problems in the low lying areas.
- Obstruction in drainage system due to heavy rainfall creates artificial floods in Kokrajhar Town during rainy season occasionally.

2:2 VULNERABILITY OF FLOOD

Based on the last eight-year (2015-2024) flood experiences, the following figures are summarized to reflect the flood vulnerability of the district.

2:3 BEHAVIORS OF RIVERS:

The water that flows along natural dongs and canals are the main source of irrigation for the agricultural fields. The Bhutan hills are also the source of a number of rivers that flow through the district and act as tributaries of the mighty Brahmaputra that flows from east to west far from the southern boundary of Kokrajhar district. The important rivers of the district that flow from north to south are the Champamati, the Gaurang, the Tipkai and the Sonkosh. There are other rivulets like the Bhur and the colorfully named Laopani. All the rivers and rivulets flowing through the district have their origin in the Bhutan hills.

2:4 BRIEF NOTES ON MAJOR RIVERS UNDER KOKRAJHAR DISTRICT

The Kokrajhar W.R. Division has been established in the year of 1984 which comprises of 2 (two) W.R.Sub-Division viz 1.Kokrajhar W.R Sub-Division & 2 Gossaigaon W.R.Sub-Division. This Division deals with the flood and erosion problems in the jurisdiction of entire Kokrajhar District.

The major river falls under Kokrajhar W.R. Division are 1. Champamati, 2 Tarong, 3. Gaurang, 4. Saralbhanga, 5. Longa, 6. Hel, 7. Gangia, 8. Guruphella, 9. Sonkosh.

River Champamati: - The river Champamati originates from Bhutan foothills and traversing through the Chirang reserve forest enters the Kokrajhar District and ultimately outfalls into the river Brahmaputra. The water level at the river started rising from 1st half of June/2022 and reached its peak value 64.02m against DL 65.52m on 16.07.2020. During peak value of water level, the river eroded the villages Kaulabhasha, Majpara and Auzarguri. Palliative measures in the form of bamboo structure & earth filling cement bags were taken up at Kauniabhasha.

River Tarrang: -The river Tarang originates from the catchment area of Chirang forest and after meeting with river Gaurang near Kaimari out falls into river Brahmaputra. The water of the river starts rising from 1 week of June/2022 and attains its peak in July/2022 when villages Sonamoyeepara and its adjoining areas got inundated. Also, village Bhramara, Sonamayeepara were eroded while the flood wave receded. Palliative measures are taken up at Ghoramara villages to arrest the erosion.

River Gaurang: - River Gaurang originates from Bhutan foothills and after traversing through Chirang reserve forest it meets with river Saralbhanga and Samukha near Chandrapara and ultimately outfalls into the river Brahmaputra. The water level starts rising from 3rd week June/2022 and attains its peak value 42.44m against DL-42.85m on 25/07/2022 and remains below danger level throughout the month. In July the water level again starts rising from 03/07/21/07/2022 and crosses the DL when it reaches value of 43.15m against DI 42.85m on 21/07/2022 During this flood season. The Chechapani village (Kokrajhar Tea Garden), Baruapara village, Mahajanpara got inundated. The roads bund in villages Chechapani and Baruapara were badly damaged and vast area of the villages Chechapani,

Baruapara, Mahajanpara, Bamungaon-II & IV were eroded. No major works were taken up to restore the damages. However, Proposal made under BTC head to protect villages Chechapani, Baruapara and a project A/E measure to protect village Bamungaon, is proposed to be taken up under FMP.

River Saralbhanga: - River Saralbhanga originates from Bhutan foothills and traversing through deep forest it enters into the plan area of Kokrajhar district and meet with river Gaurang at Chandamari 2 KM U/S of Kokrajhar Town and ultimately outfalls into the river Brahmaputra. As rain fall starts the water level starts rising from June/2020 and attains its peak value 65.95m against DL-65.92m and LR Bridge Patgaon when the embankment from Ranighat to Maoriagaon 4.40km damaged partially due to rain cut etc. and continuous bank erosion occurred at Pakriguri, Maoriagaon, Ranighat, Thalitbari and Balapara. Palliative measures taken up.

Longa: -The river Longa originates from Bhutan foothills after travelling deep forest it follows through sub plain area of Kokrajhar district and it meets with the river Gangia and falls into river Tipkai which finally out falls into the river Brahmaputra. The river during flood period of 2022 raises its water level in June. The raising of this river is similar with the river Saralbhanga. During last flood, it was observed erosion on its banks at different places like Debargaon, Laudonga, Guwabari, Habrubari, Palliative measures taken up at the said places. Severe erosion occurred in July/2022.

Hel: - The river Hel originates from Bhutan foothills, after traveling through deep forest. It coincides with the river Gangia at Durabil and flows as the river Gangia and finally outfalls into the river Brahmaputra, as Joyma and Tipkai.

Gangia: -The river Gangia is flashy type of river of high gradient with high velocity which is originates from foothills of Bhutan and travelling deep forest cultivated and homestead land. The river Gangia is one of the main tributaries of mighty river of Brahmaputra on its north bank. The river Gangia meets with the Hel River at 1.5 km D/5 of Gangia bridge NH-31 (C) the river coincides with the river Joyma at Kartimari near Sapatgram and outfalls into the river Brahmaputra as river Tipkai. During last flood period (i.e. in 2022) severe erosion observed at Oxiguri, Harinpur, Bhutiapara, Alengmari, Luchutbil, Umanagar and Anthihara. Palliative measures taken up to take measures at Luchutbil, Badlagaon, Oxiguri and Umanagar, Toktokipara, Mahishbathan, Khejurbari, Faluguri & Rimjhimi.

Guraphella: - After coinciding two rivers namely Jakati and Janali originating from Bhutan foothills the river flows as the river Guruphella travelling through alluvial soil the river meets again and then river Gangia and finally out falls into the river Brahmaputra

Sonkosh: - The river originates from Bhutan foothills, travelling through deep forest of Bhutan, Kachugaon (Assam) and West Bengal border area finally outfalls into the river Brahmaputra as Gangadhar in Bangladesh via boarder from Golokganj of Dhubri district. Raising of flood water level starts from 1" week of June/2020 as flood level record register of the river DL is 48.50m Bajugaon on

L/B. During 2020 peak value recorded 48.80m on 27/07/2020. During last flood period severe erosion observed at Simlabari, Khokshaguri, Mazadabri, Haldibari, Dainamari Bund and Garumararchar Protective measure were taken up at Garumararchar under SOPD (BTC) and palliative measures carried out at the damaged portion of the Dainamari bund.

3. STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES DURING FLOOD

3:1 FLOOD EARLY WARNING SYSTEM (FLEWS)

The North East Space Application Centre under the Flood Early warning Systems (FLEWS) will issue flood alerts to the SEOC and designated officials of ASDMA, Water Resources departments, and others. The SEOC (State Emergency Operation Centre) at ASDMA in turn will notify the concerned District Commissioner and other concern officials of the said district through phone/FAX/SMS/EMAIL/WhatsApp and other forms of the communications.

District Commissioner on receipt of Flood warning will communicate the warning expeditiously to the following officers for alerting the people and other local authorities.

- The concerned SDO(Civil)
- Revenue Circle Officer /Officers
- Superintendent of Police
- Executive Engineer Water Resource Department.
- Executive Engineer, PWD(Roads)
- Station Officer-Fire Service Station & I/C of State Disaster Response Force (SDRF).
- In giving flood warning the revenue or police officers should keep in mind that no unnecessary panic is created among the people.
- District Commissioner will take periodic feedback on the development taking place.

CEO DDMA, on receipt of the warning will also inform All the below mentioned officers.

- Superintendent. of Police
- Deputy Director, Food & Civil Supplies
- Joint Director Health Services
- District Veterinary Officer to take necessary measures so that if necessary assistance can be provided in short notice to the affected areas.
- DIPRO, if required, to give public announcement for evacuating people from vulnerable areas

Circle Officer of concerned revenue circle on receipt of warning will be done following actions immediately:

- ✓ **Circle Officers** of the concerned Revenue Circle on receipt the information from field or FLEWS will immediately mobilize **Lot Mandals, Gaonburhas, SDRF** and other agencies & resources available under his jurisdiction without waiting for order from District Commissioner or SDO (Civil) to initiate the action.
- ✓ Further, in case of probability of high intensity flood, Circle Officer will also take action for evacuation of people from the vulnerable reaches to pre-identified safe locations & preposition Men & Resources (**SDRF/NDRF/Police Force / Sand bags/ Boats / Tarpaulin** etc.) available under his jurisdiction as per the map and location specified by NESAC in its flood warning.
- ✓ **Circle Officer** will initiate his response on receipt of Flood Warning without waiting for order from District Commissioner/SDO (Civil).
- ✓ **Circle Officer** will lead the rescue and evacuations operation as per Circle Level Flood Contingency Plan.
- ✓ **Circle Officer** will keep DC/SDO (Civil) informed on hourly basis about the situation on the ground level and may request for additional resources of men, material & machines if required from DC or SDO (Civil).

- ✓ **Circle officer** will also inform BDO, so that BDO can inform PRI representatives for appropriate action.
- ✓ Circle officer may also inform VCDC Secretary and VCDC President for appropriate action.
- ✓ Lot Mandal & Gaonburhas will go to the specific location immediately & inform the villagers on the probability of any flood event and ask them to take necessary precautionary measures.

Superintendent of Police:

- ✓ SP will immediately direct Officer-in-charge of the concerned Police Station to assist the Circle Officer in rescue, evacuation & rehabilitation process.

Executive Engineer, Water Resource Department:

- ✓ Executive Engineer, WR Department will instruct *Khalasi* to keep constant vigil on Water Levels & inform Executive Engineer on any increase in the water level. Executive Engineer, WR will also take necessary temporary measures to avert any breaches in embankments.

Executive Engineer, PWD (Roads) Department:

- ✓ Executive Engineer, PWD (Roads) Department will take adequate measures to ensure that the road communication is not disrupted. He will immediately repair any breaches of road if the same is required for evacuation and supply of relief to the affected people.

Joint Director, Health Services:

- ✓ On receipt of information, Joint Director (Health) will direct SDMHO and I/C of the PHC of the concerned area to form a team of doctors equipped with necessary medical equipment and move to the affected places or evacuation camp as required by the Circle Officer.
- ✓ If situation so demands, Medical Boat Clinic will be send for medical response to marooned areas and river islands.

Station Officer, Fire & Emergency Services

- ✓ On receipt of alert from District Commissioner or SP or Circle Officer, the Station officer will immediately mobilize SDRF under him to the affected areas. He will also coordinate with NDRF team/QRT etc. for the operation.

3:2 ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN BY RESPECTIVE DEPARTMENTS DURING & POST FLOOD

(Officers of the District, in respective of department and designation, shall have to be present in the Head Quarters and available for duty as soon as flood and other disaster occur. In case of their absence from the Head Quarters prior to the occurrence of flood, they will have to return back to the Head Quarters as soon as flood occurs).

Moreover, during Disaster, there may be loss of livestock and hence carcasses need to be disposed. For disposal of carcasses, following items should be kept ready:-

JCB: - This Deptt. Do not have such logistics, so the involvement of the govt. dept. Like PWD or private parties may be required in this regard.

Carry Van:-The carry vans may be managed from private party or from carrier agencies.

Labour/Helper/Sweeper: - As per requirement Disinfectant /limestone / Mask, Glove, Boots, Spade, Rope etc.

Or

The carcass disposal task may also be given to private party on contract basis or as per instruction of the civil administration under the technical supervision of the Department.

- ✓ Assisting carcass disposal in scientific ways as per norms by digging pit (Size= L-8' x B-8' x D-6') which can accommodate animals as follows:- i) Cattle & Buffalo = 3-4 nos. ii) Small animal like Goat & Pig = 10-12 nos. However the pits should be dug as per size & numbers of dead animals. The pit should be prepared by sprinkling 6" of slaked lime on the floor of the pit followed by 6" slaked lime over the carcasses and then covered with 4' of soil over which bleaching powder or any other disinfectant to be sprinkled. 3:4 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ZONAL OFFICERS

- The Zonal officers shall remain in close contact with their respective Sub- Zones & sector officers. They will convey all actions taken by the District Disaster Management Authority to Sub Zone Officers as well as the sector officers immediately.
- They should also liaise with the concerned heads of offices like Medical / Vety / PHE/ W.R. etc.
- They shall confirm supply of sufficient copies of blank annexure-IV forms/boats requisition forms/GR requirement form and other relief materials, to their sector officers.
- They should visit all the sectors along with the sector officer to gather prior knowledge of the area and suggest measures to the DC which need special attention only.
- They will assist the sector officers to guide the sector level team. They should also collect names of volunteers/NGOs to assist in relief & rescue parties.

- The Zonal officers will prepare maps (a) On road communication for maintaining minimum road condition (communication link) highlighting the alternate routes available to carry relief material/ food stuff to the flood affected area & EE, PWD (RR) should maintain the plan accordingly & (b) Map highlighting on historically identified vulnerable places with the help of sub-Zones & Sectoral officers.
- They will prepare a mazmuli map showing (a) The Sub- Zones (b) The sectors (c) The highly flood prone villages indicated in yellow & orange colour only.
- They will identify the proposed relief camps along with the sector officer and appoint the head of the institution as the relief camp in-charge, if necessary.
- They must keep on informing the flood situation formally in annexure-IV and over telephone to District Emergency Operation Centre.
- Survey & assessment of flood affected areas shall be carried out only by authorized officers. Any other agencies conducting similar exercise shall have to do so at their own expenses.

3:5 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SUB ZONAL OFFICERS

- The Sub-Zonal officers shall remain in close contact with their respective Zonal Officer & sector officers. They will convey all actions taken by the District Disaster Management Authority to Sector Officers immediately.

3:6 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SECTORS OFFICERS

- The sector officer will visit the respective areas at least 3-4 times and collect the basic data of his sectors. He will assess the requirement of GR/other relief materials/POL for boats and submit the same to his concerned Zonal Officer/Sub. Zonal Officer.
- He will maintain the register of GR etc. /boat (both country & engine with capacity)/POL issued etc.
- He will collect the necessary annexure-IV / requirement form etc. from the Disaster Management Branch, DC's office well ahead.
- He will identify and arrange the relief camps and appoint In-charge of camp. (Head of institution, where camps are established, should be the first option for appointing as camp In-charge)
- He will ensure the fair & proper distribution of GR etc. and maintain the APRs (Actual Payee Receipt) simultaneously in duplicate. He will also contact, before the flood / during the flood with the concerned officers of Medical/ Vety / PHE / W.R./ Local Police / Army & Para Military forces and collect their address & telephone numbers.
- He will maintain a village wise population register and will divide the village population into adult & minor. He will identify the pin points for HTW (Hand tube well) installation forming users committees immediately.
- He will identify all the roads / bridges / culverts, standing crop areas / habitation structures, Embankments, dykes and keep records of everything to report in Annexure-IV in time.
- He will guide the sector level team in consultation with his Zonal officer / Sub Zonal Officer to assess the situation.
- He should keep all records properly and neatly and handover the records to his Zonal officer as soon as the flood relief operation are declared over.

- Villages, not included in any sectors will have to be looked after by the concerned sector officer, if flood occur.
- Medical / PHE / W R / Vety. / PWD (RR) / Education/ Agriculture/ P&RD/ PWD (Bldg) etc. departments should nominate representative members from their Dept. to the sector team

3:7 GUIDELINES FOR RELIEF CAMP MANAGEMENT

<p>Setting up of a Relief Camp:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On receipt of report from Revenue officials, the DC/SDO(C) will order to set up a relief camp at pre-decided location as per District/Sub-divisional disaster management plan. As far as possible, relief camps should not be set up in educational institutions. • In case new location is to be selected for the camp due to unavoidable circumstances, following points should be considered for arriving at a decision. • Camp should preferably be set up in an existing built up accommodation like a community hall. • It should be located at a safe place which are not vulnerable to landslides, flood etc. • It should be accessible by motor vehicles, if possible. • Adequate space for roads, parking, drainage, should also be there. • The area should not be prone to endemic disease like malaria. • Wide publicity should be given about the location of the camp and affected people should be evacuated and brought to the camp directly. • Emergency relief materials which include drinking water, food, bedding (mattress, sheets & blankets), baby food, mosquito repellents etc should be arranged as early as possible. • Control room/ help desk should be setup in the relief camp immediately. • Proper planning and preparedness to make the arrangement smoother.
<p>Shelter:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The shelter should be such that people have sufficient space for protection from adverse effects of the climate. • Ensure sufficient warmth, fresh air, security and privacy for their health and wellbeing. • The covered area available per person should be on an average 3.5 to 4.5 square meter. • Each family should be provided separate tent, if possible. • In warm & humid climates, proper ventilation & protection from direct sunlight must be ensured. • If plastic tents or sheeting are available, provision of an insulating layer or a double skinned roof may be considered. • Tents should not be constructed too closely together and reasonable distance should be kept between the camps to provide some form of privacy.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Priority should be given to widows and women headed households, disabled and elderly people in tent/room distribution. • Temporary shelter should neatly be planned and made. • Tents with slanting sides should be avoided as they leave no space for mobility. 3: 8 GRATUITOUS RELIEF DISTRIBUTIONS

The Chief Executive Officer, DDMA & ADC (Disaster Management) will be responsible for procurement of GR items / sanction of GR etc. on receipt of requisition. He will ensure the availability of food stuff, SK Oil, POL and other relief items beforehand. He will be assisted by the following officer and staff. The concerned zonal officers and sector officers will ensure receipt and distribution of GR items in the affected areas.

The Deputy Director of Food & Civil Supplies and Consumers Affairs & Inspectors will receive requisition of GR only. They will be assisted by supporting staff under Food & Civil Supplies Consumers Affairs Branch, DC's office, Kokrajhar.

Regarding the Ex-Gratia payment to the families of deceased persons, injured persons or for the hospitalization, the concerned circle officer will submit the report along with post mortem, medical report to the DC cum Chairman DDMA. Accordingly, the Disaster Management Branch will process the same for payment of Ex-Gratia to the affected families as per the norms of State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) as early as possible.

CALCULATION OF GR ITEMS:

Based on the available Data of the previous 5 years of GR (Rice) distribution in the district, the average 350-400 MT rice is required for worst situation of flood in the district. As per the govt directions, District has to lift the required Rice through FCI under OMSS. Further, the necessary arrangement for advance payment for lifting of the rice under OMSS will have to do as per the SOPs procuring OMSS (D) rice from FCI.

Again, the department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary, Kokrajhar has calculated the total requirement of cattle feed during emergency and total requirement of the wheat bran in the district is 570 MT for entire flood season. The requirement of the feed (wheat bran) has been calculated assuming 10% of the total livestock (Large & Small) in the district affected by Flood and calculation made taking 2Kg wheat bran/ Day/ Large Animal X 7 Days and 0.5 Kg wheat bran/Day/Small Animal X 7 Days.

3:9 TRANSPORTATION

The Addl. District Commissioner, (Nazarat) will look after the transportation facilities. He will assess the requirement of HMV/LMV etc. and will place requisition to the District Transport Officer accordingly. This cell will keep ready one machine propelled boat (if necessary) at the district headquarters all along, POL/Log sheet shall be maintained by Disaster Management Branch.

3:10 CARCASS DISPOSAL

A team for disposal of carcasses is constituted with the following members.

- District Veterinary Officer and his staff.
- Circle Officers/ Zonal Officers
- Executive Engineer, PHE and his staff
- Executive Officer, Municipal Board, Kokrajhar/ Gossaigaon/ Fakiragram.
- Local BDO/ Sub Zonal Officer and Staff his staff.

The Carcass disposal at site may be assigned to a third party on contract basis. For which the rates may be fixed prior by a committee which includes the District Commissioner, ADC (DM), DVO, Circle Officers, Executive Officer, Municipal Board, Kokrajhar/ Gossaigaon/ Fakiragram.

3:11 INQUEST & POST MORTEM

Inquest of dead bodies where necessary will have to be carried out by the concerned Circle Officers. The Joint Director, Health Services, will be responsible for the Post Mortem works as quickly as possible and would submit a report through circle officer to the District Commissioner cum Chairman DDMA.

3:12 ACTION AGAINST SELLING OF DECOMPOSED /CONTAMINATED FISH AND MEAT

The Fishery department and Veterinary department shall ensure that there is no sale of decomposed / contaminated fish/meat in the markets. The DIPRO, Kokrajhar shall make the necessary arrangement for wide publicity in such cases.

4. DISTRICT EMERGENCY OPERATION CENTRE (CONTROL ROOM)

4:1 INTRODUCTION

The district emergency operation centre (DEOC) set up under District Administration would act as a control room for flood and other disaster and is now in operation on 24x7x365 with a toll free no 1077, Landline No. 03661- 270657 & 250-200. This section is prepared to help the members of District Emergency Control Room (DEOC) to understand the structure and functioning of Control Room. Following the important three C's i.e. **Command, Control** and **Communication** for effective response in an emergency, we will be able to minimize the hardships of the community and improve the quality of the process of recovery. This control room will be able to provide timely, supported and well thought of interventions to the grass root staff as well as volunteers as it will be the hub of three C's.

The Project Officer, ASDMA, Kokrajhar is in-Charge of the District Emergency Operation Centre (DEOC). He will facilitate collection, submission of all report received in the Control Room and forwarding the same to the State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC).

4:2PURPOSE OF THE DEOC:

The District Emergency Operation Centre under the control of District Commissioner, Kokrajhar will operate round the clock and will be the nerve centre to

- ✓ Monitor
- ✓ Co-ordinate
- ✓ Implement the actions/activities for Disaster Management.

4:3 PROCEDURES TO BE FOLLOWED BY DUTY PERSONNEL IN THE DEOC:

- ✓ Daily Attendance has to be signed without fail by persons deployed in each shift.
- ✓ Ensure that all equipment's are functioning and if any repairing is required that has be brought to the notice of IC, DEOC immediately.
- ✓ Telephone Bills have to be collected in time and given to the IC, DEOC for necessary payments every month to avoid disconnection of the same.
- ✓ Any Information received from District/Police Control Room /News Channel or any other sources is to be noted down in Logbook/Register.
- ✓ The Information will be verified or to be crosschecked with ADC/SDO (Civil)/CO/PO, ASDMA/Police Control Room/ Police Station/ Fire Services of concerned area.

Flood Preparedness Plan for Agricultural Department

A profile of Agriculture in Kokrajhar district is the mainstay of majority of populace and thus holds the key to Socio-Economic development of the district. The Gross Cropped Area of the district is 1,73,412 ha as against the Net Cropped area 1,02,007ha with the cropping intensity 170%. The district has been divided into three Agro-Ecological Situation (AES) based on physiography, hydrology, soil, climate and cropping patterns viz i) Plain Zone ii) Hill & Hillock Zone and iii) Foot Hill Area. Plain zone is the largest zone covering an area of 56.7% (2.260 lakh ha) while hill and hillock zone is the smallest zone with 12% (0.478 lakh ha). The Foot Hill zone enshrines 31.3% (1.248 lakh ha) of the district. The total population of the district is 8,87,142 Nos. (Census,2011) out of which 93.80% population live in rural area. The district is in the lower Brahmaputra Valley zone.

The climate of the district Is hot summer following by monsoon of heavy rainfall and relatively cold winter with the scanty rainfall. The average annual rainfall is about 3000 mm per annum and the Mean Maximum and Minimum Temperature varies from 33° C -38° C and 8° C-10° C respectively.

The soils are predominantly sandy loam to clay loam in texture and acidity to neutral in Reaction. A large number of rivers and tributaries viz Sonkosh, Gongia, Gaurang,Champa, Hel, Tarong, Saralbhang, Longa etc. flow from North (mostly originating from Bhutan) to South of the district and meet the Brahmaputra.

Crops like Paddy, Pulses, Oilseeds and Horticultural crops are grown in Kokrajhar District. Crop Coverage for different Crops are shown below-

3 nos. of community nursery were raised (for raising of Sali Paddy Seedling) during the year 2022-23 at RARS campus, Gossaigaon, Dangarkhuti Seed Farm, Jankirkilla village covering an area of 30.0 ha as preventive measures of flood and the seedlings were distributed among the flood affected farmers and poor & needy farmers of the district as per SDRF norms.

PREVENTION, MITIGATION AND PREPAREDNESS PLAN

Prevention of natural calamities is almost difficult and of long term and regain integrated interventions by the state or Central Govt. However, some measures are taken up to reduce the impact of different disaster on Agriculture.

Flood:

1. Cultivation of submergence tolerant varieties (Swarna Sub-I, Ranjit sub-1, Bahadur sub-1, Jalashree, IR-64, Panidhan etc.) of winter paddy in flood prone areas.
2. Raising of community nursery in high land keeping in mind the time of transplanting which can be planted after flood specially varieties like Monohar Sali, Pani Sali, Culture-1 are recommended for that purpose. More stress should be given to local varieties.
3. Introduction of short duration varieties like Luit, Culture-1 as direct seeded crop after flood.
4. Construction/restoration of cheek embankments, Agri bundh, Contour bunding (Agri Engineering) before the onset of monsoon.
5. Disaster warning system could also be helpful not only to save the harvestable standing crop but also shift harvested produce to safe places.
6. Construction of Threshing floor at upland in typically summer paddy growing area.
7. More area under Mustard, Potato and Pulse may be utilized to compensate the loss of crop during flood.
8. Awareness among farmers for flood preparedness.

Regular monitoring of crop weather reports at least once in a week at the district level guides the first-hand indication of occurrences of flood. If due to heavy rainfall flash flood occurs, then field functionaries inform the Sub-Divisional level and District level with eye estimation report of submergence. Then it is transmitted to the District Disaster Management Authority in prescribed format. Basing on the report from field functionaries (ADO level) and Sub-Division response

mechanism as regards technical support, Agri input supply, pest and disease outbreak measures are kept in readiness.

Location of Flood

Topographically, lower part of the district, i.e., Eight nos. ADO Circles (Titaguri, Kahibari, Salakati, Fakiragram, Gossaigaon, Bhumka, Garufela, & Mahamaya) are flood affected. Mostly low lands are affected by flood. Heavy rainfall at the source of the Tributaries makes temporary flood in the low land of the district. As a result, some crops are completely damaged, some are partially affected/damaged. The vulnerable flood prone area of Kokrajhar District is attached in Annexure-1

Measures taken at the onset monsoon:

1. Control rooms are established in District and Sub-division level from the beginning of Kharif season with the equipment's like phone, internet etc.
2. On line crop weather situation will be monitored and appropriate corrective/mitigating measures would be taken up depending on the situation there of.
3. The extension machinery is kept in readiness with contingent plan to take any such eventually arising out of natural calamities.
4. Infrastructure readiness: - There are inputs godown at district level, SDAO level, GPSS which will be utilized for pre-positioning of different seeds and other inputs for any emergent need following damaged by natural calamities/flood.
5. Seed: - On an average each year different crops are affected by flood in various degrees. Paddy being the major crops affected by flood there is to be sufficient reinforcement measures depending on the stage of the crop and extend of damage. 7-10% of the paddy seed out of needed for the district are distributed to the farmers. Non paddy seeds like Mustard, PP<1. Lentil, are also distributed to the farmers from Govt. side. Recommended short duration variety of paddy seeds are suitable for such emergency situation in line with the contingency plan will be prepositioned in the input godown.
6. Fertilizer: - Similarly, some fertilizers are also distributed to the farmers as Govt. assistance and supply, if after flood water receded and restoration measure resume.

Pest & Disease Management: -

After flood water recedes very often the crops are infested with various pest and disease like Swarming caterpillar, plant hopper, bacterial and fungal disease, inflicting a lot of damage to different crops. The Directorate of Agriculture has taken all kinds of steps centrally through the District Agriculture Officer of the district as preparedness is necessary.

Recommended pesticide and equipment's (sprayer, duster, power sprayer etc.) are also supplied by Directorate through D.A.O. to the farmers. The field level officer like ADOs and AEAs are also made alerted. Technical advices are taken from the Scientist of KVK, Kokrajhar.

Response Plan:

Agriculture Department: - Crop production depends upon monsoon and meteorological situation in Kokrajhar district. The daily Crop submergence report, rainfall trends etc. are collected and submitted to the Director of Agriculture, BTC, Kokrajhar & Directorate of Agriculture, Assam, Khanapara, Guwahati-22.

Operationalize the Child Friendly Spaces (CFS)

Child Friendly Spaces (CFS) are the designated place within the relief camps, where children are provided a safe environment, integrated programs including play, re-creation, education, health and psycho-social support to be delivered by the related line department/agencies. The purpose of CFS is to support the resilient and well-being of children and young people through, structured activities conducted by community/ line departments in a safe, friendly and stimulating environment.

Camp Level SOPs:

Gaonburhas / P & RD Officials / PRI Members (GP President/AP Member/Ward Member)/ VCDC (Chairman and Members) in 6th scheduled areas

- Coordinate with Circle Officer and local government functionaries responsible for camp management.
- Follow the Directives issued by DDMA/RC Administration on services to be provided in camp
- Support Circle Administration in pre-identification of camps, pre-positioning of essential items (as the case may be) and other preparatory processes related to camp management
- To undertake measures to pre-identify the community halls of the Panchayat & Rural Development department located in high lands which can be used as relief camps during flood or any other disasters
- Help the local civil administration to select pre-identified areas for proper disposal of waste materials/ hazardous materials in order to maintain hygiene and cleanliness of the relief camp campus
- Participate in capacity building initiatives undertaken by the CO on Camp/Disaster Management
- Identify volunteers and leading citizens and encourage them to support in managing day to day affairs in the camp
- Support operationalization of the camp including public announcement, general administration of the camp (including management of supplies).
- Keep an inventory of all supplies, materials and services provided in the camp
- Properly plan schedule of services (registration of inmates, food distribution/preparation, organization of kitchen, services to children, pregnant women, lactating mothers, diseased, disabled, elderly etc.)
- Support in establishing help-desk in the camp which remains functional throughout camp duration.
- Support arranging locally available materials as may be required for various camp needs
- Provide information and encourage camp inmates to return to their homes as the situation improves
- Support Revenue Circle Administration in any other function as and when required related to relief camp management

School Teacher

- Participate in capacity building activities conducted by the DDMA/RC Administration
- Follow the Directives issued by IS/DEEO on services to be provided in camp

- Teacher/Non-Teaching staff designated as Camp In-charge (if school is used as Relief Camp) shall ensure registration of all inmates, issuing tickets during entry/registration. The ticket should have their identity, and details of services/supplies received during their stay in the camp and should be updated as and when they are provided with any supply/service
- He/ She should also discharge all functions as stated above for Gaonburhas/VCDC Members
- Teachers who are designated for Child Friendly Spaces shall ensure all functions as stated in the Child Friendly Spaces guideline particularly focusing upon age and situation specific education and recreation services
- Ensure special provisions for the children with disability in the relief camps along with special care for their education and make sure the same in the CFS as well
- Teachers (from schools used as relief camps and closed for educational activity) shall support the operationalization of Child Friendly Spaces in the camps
- They should also explore feasibility of operationalizing of temporary schools using locally available/pre-procured resources to reduce loss of instructional days
- Teachers shall help inmates in keeping the school clean, protecting school infrastructure and resources and in managing services in the camp under the supervision of the Camp In-Charge
- They should support in ensuring rapid re-start of schools once the camps are declared as closed
- Be on duty throughout camp duration and plan academic activities according to the situation

Auxiliary Nurse Midwife (ANM), Multi-Purpose Workers (MPWs) and Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA)

- Participate in capacity building activities conducted by the DDMA/ SDO(Civil)/ Revenue Circle Officer
- Follow the Directives issued by JDHS on services to be provided in camp
- Coordinate with Camp In-Charge and collect details of pregnant women, lactating mothers, infants, persons with chronic diseases etc.
- Under the guidance of the responsible Medical Officer, be deployed in designated camps for basic health check- up, disease surveillance, share information on good health and hygiene practices with the camp inmates.
- Map medicinal needs of the camp inmates (prescriptive) and maintain a database accordingly. Monitor the availability of prescribed medicines and their intake by inmates suffering from chronic diseases
- Conduct special drives with pregnant women, lactating mothers and infants encouraging appropriate Infant and Young Child Feeding
- Keep track of mother and child health in the camp including their feeding, medical needs etc
- Arrange fogging to prevent mosquito and other flying insects and related diseases. Eliminate breeding places of mosquito and rodent inside the camp premises.

- Spend dedicated time every day to discuss about menstrual hygiene, sexual and reproductive health and rights with women and adolescent girls in the dedicated space created for women and adolescent girls. ANM and ASHA must insist the Assistant Camp Officer to setup a dedicated privacy space for women and adolescent girls if it is not setup.
- Give special attention to malnourished children in the relief camps, monitor and report daily on the status of those malnourished children to the responsible Medical Officer.
- Provide psychosocial support to those relief camp inmates who have experienced violence, are in a trauma due to the disaster and/or lost any family member or friends.
- Health check-ups, immunization, etc. under the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) and other programmes for children, women and adolescent girls can be integrated with a CFS facility by ANM and ASHA.
- Be on duty throughout camp duration and plan activities according to the situation

Anganwadi Supervisor/Anganwadi Worker (AWW)/Helper

- In Child Friendly Spaces set up in the camps, provide appropriate services as defined in the Child Friendly Spaces guideline (in **Annexure –II**)
- Participate in capacity building activities conducted by the DDMA/RC Administration
- Follow the Directives issued by DSWO on services to be provided in camp
- Be deployed in designated relief camps and provide nutritious food and supplements to children and women beneficiaries of the respective AWC taking shelter in the camp. AWWs shall conduct a mapping of children as per their enrolment in AWCs as children enrolled in different AWCs may take shelter in one camp. Discuss with CDPO and chalk out joint strategy in advance for delivering routine ICDS services in the camps
- Coordinate with Camp In-Charge and the health functionaries and collect details of pregnant women, lactating mothers, infants etc.
- Give special attention to malnourished children in the relief camps, monitor and report daily on the status of those malnourished children to the responsible CDPO and DSWO.
- Spend dedicated time to discuss about menstrual hygiene, sexual and reproductive health and rights with women and adolescent girls in the dedicated space created for women and adolescent girls. AWW must insist the Assistant Camp Officer to setup a dedicated privacy space for women and adolescent girls if it is not setup. This may be in the form of Breastfeeding Corner set up in the Child Friendly Spaces
- Support health functionaries in providing mother and child health services in the CFS set up.
- Conduct exclusive one-to-one counseling sessions with pregnant women and lactating mothers (with support of ANM)
- Be on duty throughout camp duration and plan activities according to the situation

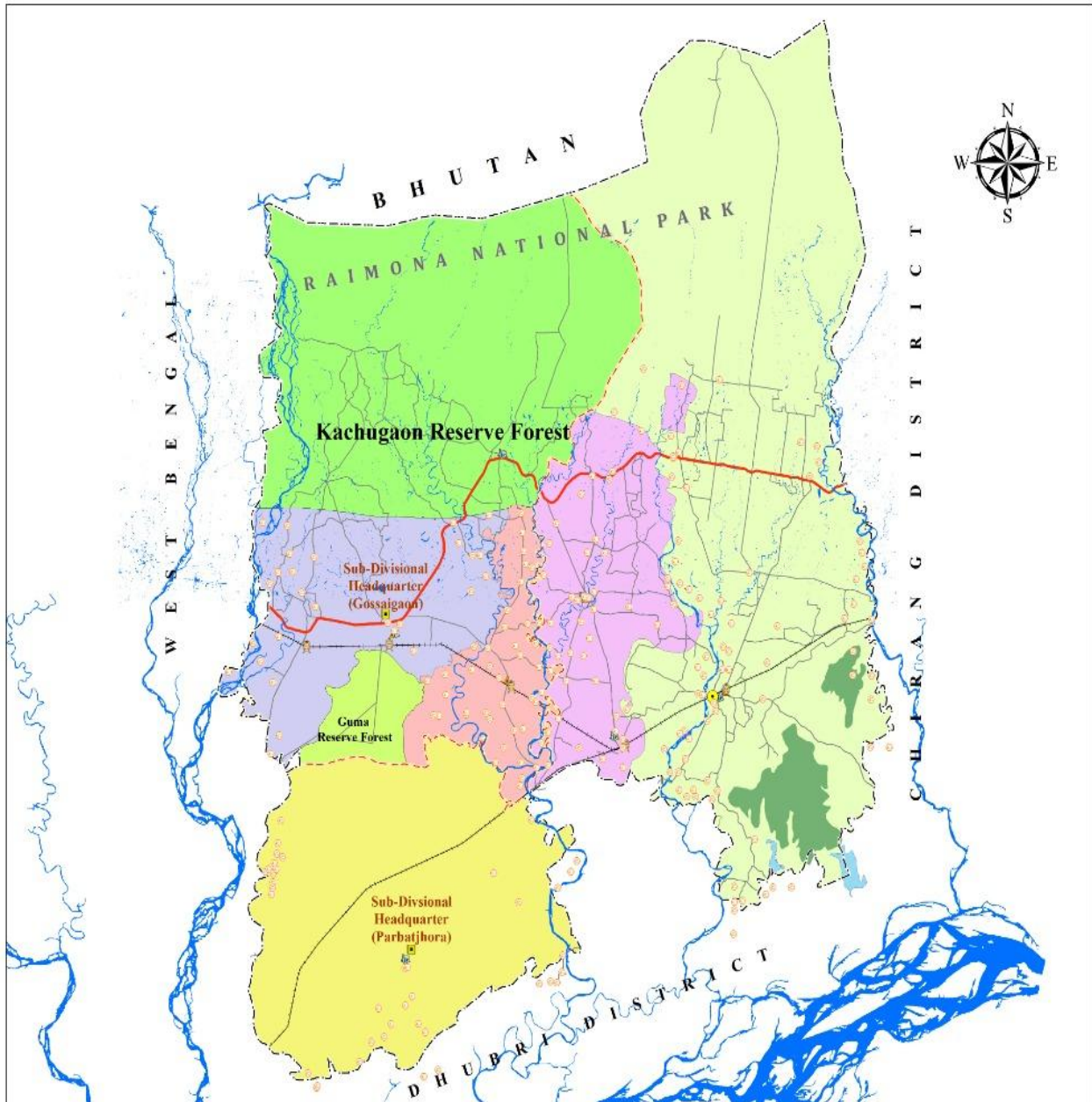

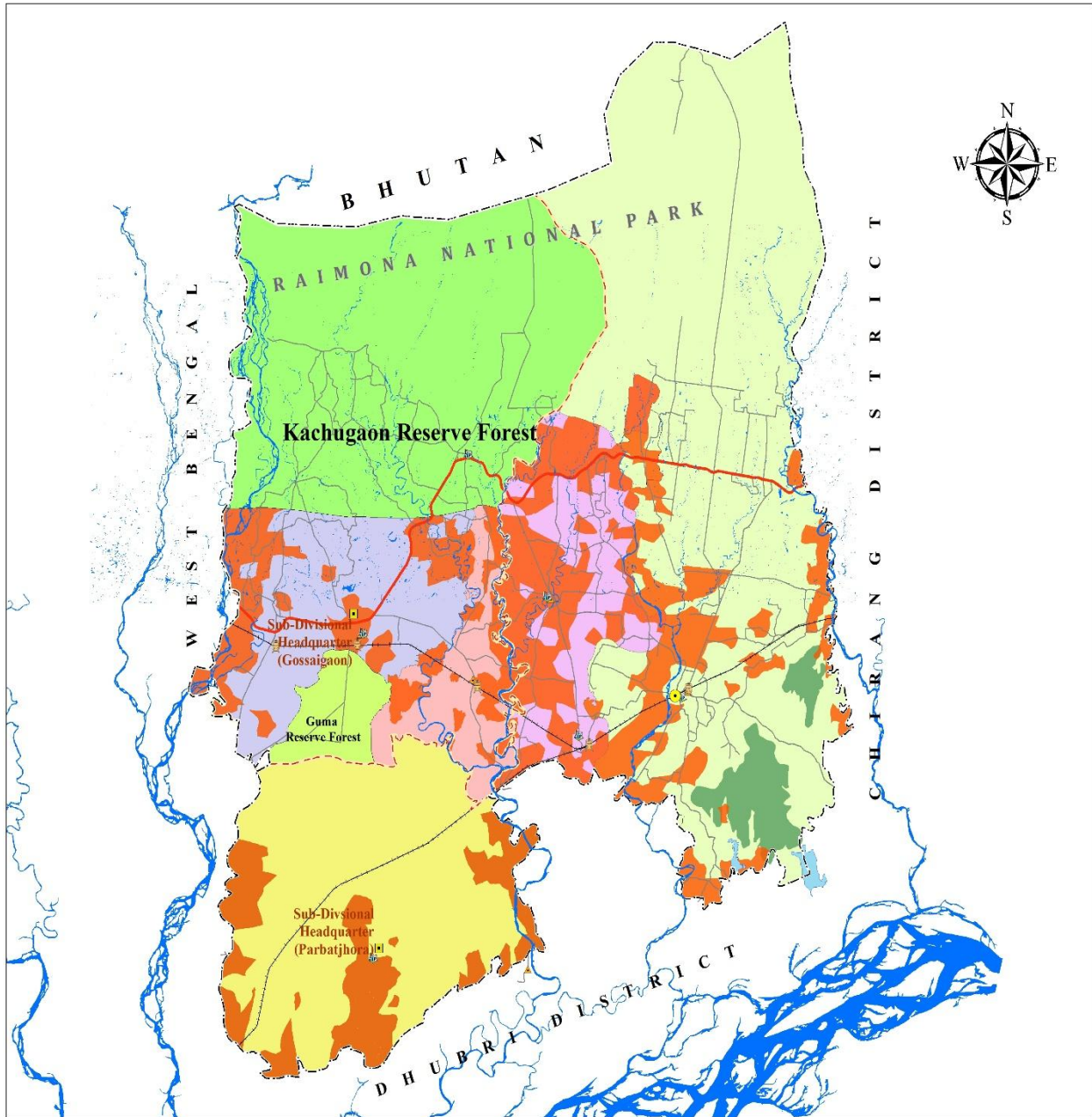
